## MIRIAM "MAKI" KNIPPLE WRITTTEN BY MIRIAM'S BELOVED SISTER, JOAN.

She was born in January 1937 in a log house in Inger, Minnesota, a small community 25 miles from the town of Deer River. My father, who was a Finnish immigrant, had built it and it housed his wife and three children. Finnish was also a big part of the language spoken in the home.

When she was about eight years old the family was given a guitar with a picture of Gene Autry on it! Soon Miriam was playing chords and singing country/western songs. This became one of her favorite things and she continued to do so all of her life, with better guitars of course!

Miriam's first eight years of school were in a one room schoolhouse a few miles from home. High school in Deer River was possible because the school had a unique feature, a dormitory where students spent the school days and nights but going home on weekends. She graduated from Deer River High School in 1953.

After graduation she worked at the First National Bank in Deer River for about three years before moving to California where she had many relatives. She worked for Pan American Airways and joined their flying club earning a pilots license. She made many trips to Minnesota and various other places.

She later left Pan Am and went to Juneau, Alaska where she met and married her husband Charles Knipple. He was a mechanic at Alaska Airlines. They had a home there and later moved to Seattle.

After Chuck's retirement they purchased a motor home and for over ten years it became their "home." They traveled to all of the states and most of Canada. When they decided they should settle down and get a house they decided they liked the desert and chose Yuma, Arizona.

After Chuck's death Miram stayed in Yuma, spending her summers in Minnesota, but now her traveling companion was her sister Joan. They usually made one longer trip each summer. She would leave for Yuma around Labor Day as she did not want to be caught in Minnesota during the winter.

The winter in Yuma before her passing, she still went out to the desert and other places to be "picking and singing" with her guitar.

## DIRECTOR'S CORNER

#### Ways You Can Support Your Local Nonprofits

While many of our Yuma nonprofits work directly to meet those needs in our community, they are struggling to find the resources to do so. Personally, I can say that Hospice of Yuma has experienced this repeatedly over the last 5 years, and it is very unsettling. Many nonprofits have never bounced back fully from the pandemic which began in 2020. Since that time there have been many changes leading to periods of economic uncertainty and this has impacted many donors negatively. It is understandable why many people have chosen to decrease support. Unfortunately, the decreased support has always seemed to occur at a times when the needs of so many are exploding. I want to share 3 things that you could do to become the hope for so many individuals and families right now in our community who are struggling.

#### 1. Donate Money, Supplies, or Your Time

It is okay if you do not feel comfortable making a monetary donation at this time. Just remember, that if you do want to donate, every penny counts. Sometimes supporters don't give because they think they can't give "enough" to make a difference, but any nonprofit organization will tell you that <u>many small donations add up fast and can make a big difference</u>.

For those of you who are able to file long form on your tax returns, it is never too early to consider an end-of-year gift as it is a wonderful way of helping others and yourselves. Gifts of cash, securities, and real estate are always welcome donations. Please speak with your tax advisor if you believe you can donate and ask how it might help you this tax season.

If you do not have the means to give cash, please consider volunteering your time and talents. Just ask the nonprofit you want to support where you could volunteer to help. Trust me, they will let you know.

#### 2. Share on Social Media

Spreading awareness is a great way to show support, if you are unable to donate or do not have time to volunteer consider sharing your favorite nonprofit's post on social media and encourage your family and friends to follow and support them.

Being an advocate for a Yuma nonprofit you care about will help spread their mission, stories of success, and potentially lead to them receiving donations. Personal testimonies shared about your favorite nonprofit on their social media page encourages others to give and support. As a bonus, you are also spreading uplifting news to your friends and family. Seeing dedicated work from nonprofits can make people feel more hopeful, at a time when we all need to feel more attached and hopeful about the future.

#### 3. Sign Up Online to Make a Recurring Donation

For those that can give, sustainable giving in the form of a small monthly donation helps local nonprofits plan for the future. National data shows that <u>recurring donations are often five</u> times more valuable than a one-time that might be slightly higher in the short term.

Not only are recurring donations critical for nonprofits like Hospice of Yuma, but this is also a great time to become a monthly donor because you can give smaller, more feasible amounts spread out over the year, rather than giving one lump sum.

Recurring gifts are a great way to show support for the local nonprofits and the work they do in the Yuma community without breaking the bank.

We are very thankful at Hospice of Yuma for the many donors who have signed up for repeated monthly donations over the past year. Whether the donation is \$10 a month or \$170 per month (the cost of one day of care for a hospice patient), we are thankful for all of you. 


